

WORK IN PROGRESS GOODBYE JULIA



In 2005, Sudan signed a peace treaty to end its civil war, which displaced 2 million southern citizens. Six months after the treaty, SPLM leader John Garang was killed, causing violence in the capital Khartoum. Mona, a retired singer from the north, hits a Southern child with her car and calls her husband Akram for help. Akram kills the Southern man chasing her, unaware of the accident. Mona keeps the accident a secret and offers the victim's wife, Julia, a job as a housemaid. Over the years, the women build a friendship despite the deception. However, when Julia meets a separatist soldier, Majier, the truth comes out. Goodbye Julia is a tale of prejudice and pride, exploring the darkness and resilience of the human heart.

Moreover, just recently, at the Asia Pacific Screen Awards, THE STRANGER was nominated for Best Director and won the award for Best Cinematography.



The documentary showcases three chant-makers as their songs become a protest, covering the rise of revolutionary chants during Spring 2018 and their impact on Sudanese society. The film also explores the emotional roller-coaster experienced by the revolutionaries, including the tragic sit-in massacre, and ends with the masses back in the streets ready to resist the military coup. The young revolutionaries reclaim their agency and space, strengthened by their unwavering belief in their cause.

Struggling financially, Asia is offered a risky opportunity to smuggle goods for wealthy clients. Asia initially declines, but as her father's health deteriorates, and he requires a costly kidney transplant, she reconsiders the offer and embarks on a grueling expedition across the desert to rendezvous with the smugglers. but gets caught up in a general strike and riots protesting the government's fuel price hike. Asia is forced to confront unexpected adversaries.
